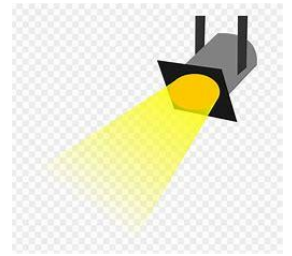


HAGAS: Artist in the Spotlight
